



Chablis, half way between Paris and Beaune, forms the real gateway to Burgundy's treasure-house of wines. The vineyards, lying on both sides of the River Serein, cover 6,800 hectares (some 17,000 acres) in 20 villages. Of the 4,700 hectares in production, La Chablisienne alone represents nearly 25% and produces every one of the Chablis appellations. Over the years and in every part of the globe, these white wines from the Chardonnay grape have won extraordinary acclaim.
